Notice to Customers of Prince George County Utilities Along Sandy Ridge Road and in The Meadows Subdivision

Este informe contiene información muy importante sobre su agua potable.

BOIL YOUR TAP WATER

Failure to follow this advisory could result in stomach or intestinal illness.

The Virginia Department of Health, in conjunction with the Prince George Health Department and Prince George County Water System, is advising residents along Sandy Ridge Road and The Meadows Subdivision to use boiled tap water or bottled water for drinking and cooking purposes as a safety precaution. This precaution is necessary due to recent construction activities that disrupted water services and may have allowed bacteria to enter the water system.

DO NOT DRINK TAP WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST

Boiled or bottled water should be used for drinking, beverage and food preparation, and making ice **until further notice**. Boiling kills bacteria and other organisms in the water. Boiling is the preferred method to assure that the tap water is safe to drink. Bring all tap water to a rolling boil, **let it boil for one (1) minute,** and let it cool before using, or use bottled water.

If you cannot boil your tap water....

- An alternative method of purification for residents that do not have gas or electricity available is to use liquid household bleach to disinfect water. The bleach product should be recently purchased, free of additives and scents, and should contain a hypochlorite solution of at least 5.25%. Public health officials recommend adding 8 drops of bleach (about 1 teaspoon) to each gallon of water. The water should be stirred and allowed to stand for at least 30 minutes before use.
- Water purification tablets may also be used by following the manufacturer's instructions.

We will inform you when you no longer need to boil your water. <u>The disruption of service has been corrected.</u> However, to ensure the water is safe to drink we are flushing, disinfecting and testing the water system. We anticipate completing all corrective activities by July 31, 2022.
